Planning

Committee Membership.

Cllr Debbie Dean has resigned from the Planning Committee due to ill health. Her place has been taken by Cllr Debbie McCallum.

Planning officer

Rachel Smith a Senior Planning Officer recently died in her sleep. She was an outstanding planning officer. Philip Ridley the Head of Planning, has been moved to another post, Head of Sizewell Planning. Ben Woolnough is now Head of Planning and Coastal Management at East Suffolk Council.

Gravel Pit Application (SCC/0092/24SC/SCREEN)

As you are all aware an application has been made for a scoping application for a Gravel Pit and entrance track to be constructed on the border between Westerfield PC and Tuddenham PC and very close to the Witnesham Parish Boundary.

All PC's are working together to object to this application. A meeting of interested Parish Councils was held on 24th October and the MP the County Cllr and myself attended. However, all traffic movements will start in Westerfield via a new track onto the main Westerfield Road. If an application is approved there will be at least 160 lorry movements per day. But where do these lorries go when diversions are in place? Apart from that my fear is that this will have a detrimental effect on surrounding villages and both the County Cllr and myself will be watching very closely for a full application. This is a SCC area of the Planning System and ESC is only a Statutory Consultee. If approved it could be 16 years of quarrying.

New Recycling Scheme

A new recycling scheme has been agreed by East Suffolk Council which will require extra wheelie bins to be delivered to every household. Further details will be promulgated soon and it will have to take effect by 2026. Basically, you will have two recycling bins and a food caddy. Bin emptying will work on a 3 week cycle for some bins. (see last pages)

Blue Bin recycling will contain glass, tins, cartons, plastics.

Green Bin recycling will contain paper and card.

Brown Bin will be for garden waste.

Black Bin will be for refuse.

Caddy (smaller than a wheelie) will be for bio-waste. Ie food waste.

Local company awarded contract for Marina Centre works.

Local company P.J Spillings has been awarded the contract to deliver the construction works for part of the Battery Green development in Lowestoft.

The work will see the demolition of the northern wing of East Suffolk Council's former Marina Customer Services Centre and internal alterations to the remainder of the building to create a repurposed space for the creative sector. The Battery Green development is a multi-million-pound redevelopment and is one of five transformational regeneration projects which received £24.9m from the Government's Towns Fund in 2022.

Designed by Norwich-based architects Chaplin Farrant, the Battery Green development will provide a new cultural and community hub with studio space for creative businesses together with a leisure complex and restaurant.
